Advanced, Liberal, 4 credits

Group Work is considered to be an advanced level knowledge that is liberal. It represents higher level theory and concepts that human service workers have acquired through applied practice. Advanced level knowledge indicates that you are able to use terminology, concepts, and theory in an applied way. Group Work is more often about why we do things (i.e., liberal) and not necessarily how we do things (i.e., non-liberal). At Empire State College, the Group Work course is offered at the advanced level.

The responses to the questions should be submitted in a Word document and uploaded in PLA Planner.
