Degree Guidelines for Associate in Arts and Associate of Science

Community and Human Services is a field of study that aims to prepare learners to improve the quality of life of individuals, families, groups, and communities; develop, enhance, and improve access to services for people in need; and promote equality and social justice.

Studies in Community and Human Services emphasize five essential foundations. **For the associate degree, students are expected to meet a minimum of at least three foundations through courses and/or prior learning assessment and explain in the rationale essay how these foundations are met. Below are suggested courses that can be utilized to meet each foundation; these courses have been mapped to meet the learning outcomes for the foundation. Courses in other disciplines may also be utilized; students are expected to discuss how the course in the other discipline meets the foundation in the rationale essay.**
