## **Transfer Articulation Agreement**

Associate Degree (A.S.) in Business Administration to a Cohort Program for a Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Business, Management and Economics with a concentration in Business Administration

Empire State College (ESC) and Finger Lakes Community College, both of the State University of New York, agree to develop a Transfer Agreement in Business Administration. The agreement is designed to support transfer students during their transition to Empire State College, and:

- Ease the transition process for FLCC graduates to an educational model comprising blended weekend residency courses, independent study, online courses, and small group seminars;
- Ensure a smooth transfer for FLCC graduates to Empire State College;
- Provide an affordable and convenient baccalaureate degree option for FLCC graduates who want to remain close to their homes and/or community;
- Provide clear guidelines for FLCC graduates to follow during the transition.

Empire State College will offer A.S. degree graduates in Business Administration from Finger Lakes Community College who choose to participate in this transfer program an opportunity to enroll in the cohort program leading to a Bachelor of Science degree. FLCC graduates meeting ESC's admissions requirements will become Empire State College students upon admission.

### How Transfer to the Cohort Program Works

Empire State College requires 124 credits for a bachelor's degree, of which FLCC graduates in this B.S. cohort program would be expected to complete a minimum of 61 credits at Empire State College. Empire State College's requirements for a bachelor's degree entail a minimum of 45 upper-division credits, 24 of which must be in the concentration. Each participating student will be able to transfer all credits earned as part of their A.S. degree to Empire State College, as long as they fit into the student's designed bachelor's degree program.

FLCC students who wish to transfer more than 63 credits to Empire State College may elect to transfer under the guidelines of the existing Pathways Transfer agreement that permits the transfer of up to 79 credits at the 100-200 introductory level (through transcripted credit or prior learning assessment) and up to 93 credits total (including upper level transcripted credits or prior learning assessment). Such students would not enter the cohort program, but would

instead take advantage of the other modes of delivery available at Empire State College. (See Appendix B for additional general transfer guidelines.)

As part of this agreement, Empire State College will provide the following: (1) an opportunity to participate in a cohort program of weekend residencies at the FLCC Victor Campus, (2) individual or group educational planning and mentoring for all transferring Business Administration students, (3) outreach to faculty and transfer office staff at Finger Lakes Community College to provide program information, and (4) information sessions for students at FLCC, at Empire State College locations, and online.

Finger Lakes Community College agrees to provide: (1) access for transfer students to campus facilities and resources (e.g., library, academic support, computer labs), (2) promotion of the program on campus to current students, faculty advisors, and alumni, and (3) inclusion of this transfer agreement in any college publications where such agreements are listed (e.g., college catalog, website, transfer office brochures).

Business Administration (A.S.) to Business, Management and Economics (B.S.) students may enroll at Empire State College on a full or part-time basis. With advisement from their faculty mentor at ESC, students will design a degree program similar to the sample provided on page 4 for a concentration in Business Administration (Appendix A).

This agreement becomes effective when all signatures are affixed, and remains in effect for five years from that date (of last signature). The agreement may be amended or renewed by mutual agreement and will be formalized via revision of this agreement.

### Appendix B

### Empire State College General Policies and Procedures for Transfer

- Students successfully completing degree requirements for an A.A., A.S., or A.A.S. and transferring in the entire associate degree will be able to transfer to Empire State College all credit earned for the associate degree, including "D" grades that are part of the completed degree. If the entire associate degree is not used toward the Empire State College degree program, "D" grades are not transferable.
- 2. The residency requirement for a 124 credit bachelor's degree is 31 credits. Students may transfer in the remaining 93 credits through transcripted credit and/or prior learning assessment<sup>1</sup>. A student may exceed stated credit minimums in certain circumstances to preserve the integrity of components that meet degree requirements.
- Any courses taken at Finger Lakes Community College beyond the associate degree will be evaluated for transfer separately from the associate degree based on Empire State College's advance standing policies.
- 4. There is no statute of limitations regarding the age of acceptable learning substantiated by transcript except in some areas, technologies and science for instance, where that learning may be outmoded and may not be accepted if it is crucial to the structure of a degree program concentration.
- 5. Students earning a bachelor's degree from Empire State College must fulfill all graduation requirements, which include completing 45 advanced-level credits of which 24 are in the concentration. SUNY also requires the completion of 30 general education credits across 7 of 10 designated areas, which must include mathematics and basic communication.
- 6. All students need to complete the application process and meet all admissions criteria before being accepted to Empire State College. Students must submit the Empire State College Application for Admission form along with an official transcript(s) of their completed course work to the Office of Admissions, Empire State College, 2 Union Avenue, Saratoga Springs, NY 12866.
