B. Partnership Information & Admissions Requirements

Empire State College (ESC), of the State University of New York, and Stella and Charles Guttman Community College (GCC), of the City University of New York, agree to develop a Pathways Transfer Agreement in Business, Management and Economics. The agreement is designed to support transfer students during their transition to Empire State College, and:

- Ease the transition process for GCC graduates to an educational model comprised of independent study, online courses, and small group seminars;
- Ensure a smooth transfer for GCC graduates to ESC;
- Provide an affordable and convenient baccalaureate degree option for GCC graduates who want to remain close to their homes and/or community;
- Provide clear guidelines for GCC graduates to follow during the transition.

ESC will offer A.A. degree graduates in GCC's Business Administration program an opportunity to participate in the Pathways Transfer Program into a Bachelor of Science degree. GCC graduates meeting ESC's admissions requirements will become ESC students upon admission.

How the Pathways Transfer Program Works

During their first year at Empire State College, students in the Pathways Transfer Program may, with advisement, cross-register for additional credits at Guttman Community College beyond the associate's degree. These lower-level credits will be applicable to the baccalaureate degree program by satisfying SUNY General Education requirements or needed pre-requisite courses. Up to 79 total lower-level credits can be transferred in from GCC, leaving at least 45 upper-level credits to be completed at Empire State College. This includes 24 upper-level credits within one of the Business, Management and Economics concentrations, consistent with the College's requirements for a bachelor's degree. Each participating student will be able to transfer all credits earned as part of their associate's degree to Empire State College, as long as they fit into the student's designed bachelor's degree program.

Business Administration (A.A.) students may enroll at Empire State College on a full or parttime basis. With advisement from their faculty mentor at ESC, students may elect to design a degree program similar to one of the sample concentrations provided on pages 3-5.

C. Transfer Credit Awarded

GCC graduates who complete the Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree in Business Administration will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Business, Management and Economics at ESC with a concentration in Accounting, Business Administration, Economics, Finance, Human Resources, Marketing, or Management

E. Articulation Agreement Follow-Up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

This agreement becomes effective when all signatures are affixed, and remains in effect for five years from that date (of last signature). The agreement may be amended or renewed by mutual agreement and will be formalized via revision of this agreement. In addition, when either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments or programs, as selected by their Chairpersons and/or program directors.

- 2. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement (e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.):
 - Both institutions agree to publicize this articulation agreement on their respective websites.
 - Transfer advisors at GCC will promote this agreement with eligible students, faculty advisors, and alumni.
 - ESC will provide information sessions for interested students at GCC, at an ESC location, or online.
 - ESC will provide outreach to faculty and transfer counseling staff at GCC.

Appendix A: Empire State College Policies and Procedures for Transfer

- 1. Students successfully completing degree requirements for an A.A., A.S., or A.A.S. and transferring in the entire associate degree will be able to transfer to ESC all credit earned for the associate degree, including "D" grades that are part of the completed degree. If the entire associate degree is not used toward the ESC degree program, "D" grades are not transferable.
- 2. The maximum advanced standing allowed toward a bachelor's degree is 93 credits, which means that students must complete at least 31 upper-level credits at ESC.
- Any courses taken at GCC College beyond the associate degree will be evaluated for transfer separately from the associate degree based on ESC's advance standing policies.
- 4. There is no statute of limitations regarding the age of acceptable learning substantiated by transcript except in some areas, technologies and science for instance, where that learning may be outmoded and may not be accepted if it is crucial to the structure of a degree program concentration.
- 5. Students earning a bachelor's degree from ESC must fulfill all graduation requirements, which include completing 45 advanced-level credits of which 24 are in the concentration. SUNY also requires the completion of 30 general education credits across 7 of 10 designated areas, including mathematics and basic communication.
- 6. All students need to complete the application process and meet all admissions criteria before being accepted to ESC. Students must submit the ESC Application for Admission form along with an official transcript(s) of their completed course work to the Office of Admissions, Empire State College, 2 Union Avenue, Saratoga Springs, NY 12866. These forms can be found at www.esc.edu/admissions.
